KEYNOTE PRESENTERS



Bryan E. Bledsoe, DO, FACEP, FAAEM, Paramedic

Dr. Bryan Bledsoe is an emergency physician, researcher, and EMS author. He is Professor of Emergency Medicine at the University of Nevada, School of Medicine in Las Vegas. He is the author of numerous EMS textbooks and has over 1 million books in print. Dr. Bledsoe was named a “Hero of Emergency Medicine” in 2008 by the American College of Emergency Physicians and a “Hero of Health and Fitness” by Men’s Health magazine. Dr. Bledsoe is medical director for MedicWest ambulance in Las Vegas and the annual Burning Man event.



Gordon Graham

Gordon Graham is a retired 33-year veteran of California Law Enforcement. During his tenure as a police professional, he was awarded his Teaching Credential from California State University, Long Beach. He was later graduated from University of Southern California with a Master’s Degree in Safety and Systems Management.

Subsequent to this he was graduated from Western State University with a Juris Doctorate. His education as a Risk Manager and experience as a practicing Attorney, coupled with his extensive background in public safety, have allowed him to rapidly become recognized as a leading professional speaker with multiple areas of expertise.

Mr. Graham has taken this background as a street cop, supervisor and manager and coupled it with his formal education as a risk manager and his education and experiences as an attorney and is now President of Lexipol — a company designed to standardize policies, procedures and training within fire departments around America.

Gordon is the co-founder and co-owner of the popular website www.FireFighterCloseCalls.com and helped the IAFC develop their version of the same concept — www.FireFighterNearMiss.com.

Over the last decade, Mr. Graham has spoken to over 300,000 different law enforcement, fire personnel, dispatchers and EMS professionals from around the world (including NFA and IAFC), no doubt some from your department. In 1995, he was presented with the Governor’s Award for excellence in law enforcement training by Governor Wilson (sole recipient).

In 2005 he received recognition from the IAFC for his lifelong work in improving firefighter safety and performance. In 2008 he received the lifetime achievement award from California POST.

KEYNOTE PRESENTERS



Carolyn C. Majors, DO

Dr. Majors is a general surgeon, who attended medical school at Des Moines University in Des Moines, Iowa. She then completed her surgery residency at Mount Clemens General Hospital in Southeast Michigan, and did a portion of her training at the Detroit Medical Center. After residency, she started her practice at Mount Clemens General Hospital, while performing trauma surgery at Sinai Grace Hospital in Detroit, Michigan.

Dr. Majors is the current Trauma Medical Director for Providence Alaska Medical Center.

She is working with the trauma committee to achieve a Level II Trauma Center Verification from the American College of Surgeons for Providence Alaska Medical Center. The role of the Trauma Medical Director is to facilitate improvements in trauma care and lead the hospital in all aspects of trauma center verification. Dr. Majors actively participates in the direct care of trauma and acute care surgery patients. Dr. Majors is an Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) instructor and she is also active in professional societies such as The Eastern Association for the Surgery of Trauma and The American College of Osteopathic Surgeons.

Dr. Majors moved to Alaska to be with her husband, and she spent time travelling to Fairbanks and Juneau to perform surgery, until she joined Providence Alaska Medical Center. She specializes in acute care surgery and trauma, in addition to most other general surgery procedures.



Larry B. Mellick, MS, MD

Dr. Mellick served as the first chairman of the new Department of Emergency Medicine at the Medical College of Georgia and continued in that role until 2003. His first academic chairman role began in 1993 when he took over leadership of the Department of Emergency Medicine at Loma Linda University Medical Center in San Bernardino County, California.

Dr. Mellick attended the Medical College of Ohio at Toledo from 1974 to 1977 and accomplished his specialty training in the military. His first residency was in Pediatrics (Madigan Army Medical Center) and four years later he completed a residency in Emergency Medicine (Brooke Army Medical Center). He holds three board certifications (Pediatrics, Emergency Medicine and Pediatric Emergency Medicine). In addition to being the first

academic chairman at the MCG department of emergency medicine he started the pediatric emergency medicine programs at Georgia Regents University and Loma Linda University Medical Center. He also began the successful pediatric emergency medicine fellowship at Loma Linda.

Dr. Mellick has had the opportunity to be the editor of multiple emergency medicine publications published through the American Health Consultants. He was the creator and first editor of the clinical monograph, Pediatric Emergency Medicine Reports.

For several years Dr. Mellick was one of three full-time physicians working full-time for the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He was fully credentialed with the FBI for approximately ten years and worked with the Hostage Rescue Team (HRT) and the FBI Training Academy during that period of time.

He has been the author of multiple publications and his research interest has been headache and orofacial pain. In recent years Dr. Mellick has developed an interest in clinical photography and the creation of training videos for emergency medicine. His popular YouTube channel has nearly 500 videos. He is a contributor to well-known emergency medicine textbooks such as the Atlas of Emergency Medicine and Roberts and Hedges' Clinical Procedures in Emergency Medicine. Currently, Dr. Mellick has been appointed by American Board of Pediatrics and the American Board of Emergency Medicine to be a question writer for Pediatric Emergency Medicine Sub-board examination.



Peter Rhee, MD, MPH, FACS, FCCM, DMCC

Dr. Rhee is currently the Chief of Trauma, Critical Care, Burns and Emergency Surgery and is a Professor of Surgery at the University of Arizona. He is also Vice Chair for Clinical Affairs in the Department of Surgery at University of Arizona and holds the Martin Gluck Endowed Chair. Previously, Dr. Rhee held appointments as Director of the Navy Trauma Training Center; Attending Surgeon at Los Angeles County Medical Center; Professor of Surgery at the University of Southern California; and Professor of Surgery at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS). Academically, Dr. Rhee received a BS in Health Systems Engineering from the Georgia Institute of Technology (summa cum laude, 1983), a MD from USUHS (1987), a MPH in Health Services from the University of Washington (1995), and a Diploma in the Medical Care of Catastrophes from the Society of Apothecaries of London (1999). He completed his internship in surgery at Balboa Naval Hospital (1987-1988) and his residency in general surgery at the University of California at Irvine (1988-1992). Dr. Rhee also completed a Fellowship in Trauma and Critical Care at the University of Washington's Harborview Medical Center (1993-1995). He is double boarded in general surgery and surgical critical care.
