I'm Michael Lawson, President of OhioHealth Grant Medical Center. ▪ I want to start out by congratulating you on making the decision to come to the conference today, to learn more about EMS topics in the interest of saving more lives. ▪ OhioHealth is committed to our partnership with EMS and this conference is one way we can provide you with information about the latest advancements and to hear from leaders in the field. ▪ I also see that commitment as a hospital president. ▪ OhioHealth is investing almost \$6 million in an expansion of trauma services at Grant. ▪ Grant is not only a Level I Trauma Center, but the busiest in the state. ▪ Our existing trauma bays are designed for a trauma program with a volume of 28-hundred patients a year. ▪ Last year, we treated more than double that number. ▪ So, we are building a new, third trauma bay to better treat multiple traumas at once. ▪ We are also building a new state-of-the-art dual helipad, to accommodate two helicopters at once. ▪ And, it will be spacious enough for the newer, larger medically advanced helicopters to land. ▪ The current helipad will remain as a third alternate landing area. ▪ So, we can take three helicopters at once. Keep them coming! 	

- We're also improving our **imaging space and capabilities** in our Emergency Department.
- Because of these changes, we are also able to do what many of you have been asking for. We will **renovate and expand our EMS room**.
- Construction will start soon on these improvements and they could be completed by the end of the year.
- Other plans for expansion at Grant include the **OhioHealth Bone and Joint Center** at Grant and with our heart services.
- They're all exciting advancements for our Columbus community.
- And right now, I'd like to thank you for all that you do for our community.
- The service you provide... taking care of some of our sickest and critically injured patients... is invaluable.
- You all are key partners in keeping community members safe and healthy.
- I would now like to introduce **Dr. Marco Bonta**, Medical Director of Trauma Services at OhioHealth Riverside Methodist Hospital.
