 <p>4 minutes</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Thank you all for joining us today. ▪ I would like to welcome you on behalf of OhioHealth’s physicians and associates. ▪ I know many of you are “regulars” at OhioHealth Grant Medical Center. ▪ We are a Level I Trauma Center, and you help make that a reality for us. ▪ But, we are more than just an advanced medical center. ▪ Grant Level I Trauma is also an exceptional team of caring professionals that strive to make a difference in the lives of ours patients and families that we serve. ▪ We are the place that saves lives, but we aim to do even more than that. ▪ We want to be the ones who prevent it from ever happening in the first place. ▪ Injury prevention is a major component of a trauma program. ▪ That’s why we’re working to make an impact on safe driving for teenagers. ▪ One study at Grant looks at the advanced driving skills that teens need to stay safe behind the wheel. ▪ Driver ERROR is the primary reason our teen drivers are dying, not distraction. ▪ It’s their inability to handle their vehicle when they find themselves in a dangerous driving situation. ▪ Which is why our study, the first of its kind in the nation, is groundbreaking. ▪ The study is going on now and targets teens between the ages of 15 ½ and 19.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Then, there are the members of the community on the other end of the age spectrum, the elderly, who are at such a high risk for the #1 trauma we see: falls. ▪ OhioHealth was recently chosen to pilot a tool that was developed by the CDC to assess fall risk in the primary care setting. ▪ We are now able to assess anyone 65 and older on an annual basis for their fall risk, provide the necessary interventions and educational tools as well as community exercise programs. ▪ Were you aware that OhioHealth offers two evidenced based programs around the Columbus area that specifically target older adults and educate them on how NOT to fall? ▪ These programs are called Matter of Balance and Stepping On. ▪ Our hope is to help more members of the community, so they don't end up in our Emergency Department. ▪ We are very proud to be the top Level 1 Trauma Center in Ohio, and, yes, we are the busiest, but our reach within the community goes far beyond the confines of our hospital walls. ▪ We are making an impact and a difference <i>within</i> our community and we are very proud of our partnership with EMS to make that happen. ▪ Thank you for being such valued partners. ▪ At this time, I would like to introduce the OhioHealth system director for EMS, Holly Herron. ▪ Please join me in welcoming Holly. <p>[Hold for applause]</p>

 1 minute	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Welcome back ▪ Our special guest, Robert Harlow, had an unfortunate day of April 17th, 2015 ▪ Liberty Township Fire in Powell, responded to a motorcycle crash into a tree. Battalion 321 and Liberty Paramedics found Robert un-helmeted and unconscious. ▪ His motorcycle was down an approximately 15 foot embankment and Robert was about 30 feet away in front of his motorcycle. His was face down with his head curved downward. ▪ When paramedics moved him into a supine position, he took an agonal breath. He was intubated and had an IO placed. ▪ Robert had a scalp laceration, abrasions across his abdomen, and a right knee laceration. ▪ Robert was transported to OhioHealth Riverside Methodist Hospital's Level II Trauma Center.

We are very honored that you are here. ▪ Can you tell us a little more about what happened that evening and how it has affected you? <div style="color: blue; font-weight: bold; text-align: center;">[Time for response]</div> ▪ In addition to the injuries identified by the paramedics, Robert had some instability with a strain to C3-4, a closed, distal left fibular fracture, and a right 4th metatarsal fracture.
